Saturday July 20th at 3.0 p.m.

Visit to Outwood Mill (Surrey's working windmill). W.Millar, Esq. will speak about the mill. A small charge is made for entry. For motorists approaching from Redhill/Reigate along the Horley Road, turn left at Salfords (Honeycrock Lane), at a T junction turn left, pass the Prince of Wales Public House, then turn right, and at another T turn left and the mill will be seen. By public transport bus 405 from Redhill may be taken to Honeycrock Lane, Salfords, but the mill is about 3 miles walk from that point. In these circumstances those motorists with spare seats in their cars are asked to notify Mrs. Haynes (Lea:3549) and those requiring transport are asked to do the same and she will try and make suitable arrangements. Those enjoying lifts are asked to donate 2/6 to the funds of the Society.

Saturday August 10th at 2.30 p.m.

Meet at Juniper Hall Field Centre. Walk (not more than 4 miles) through beautiful Surrey countryside. Mr. Docherty of the Field Centre will demonstrate the "formation of the Mole Valley." Car parking at Burford Bridge (5 minutes walk from Juniper Hall). The walk will conclude at Burford Bridge.
