Whitehall is a timber-framed house with white-painted weatherboarding, built in about 1500. The house has connections with
Nonsuch Palace and Cheam School.

The Lumley Chapel, in the grounds of St Dunstan's Church, is all that remains of the church that once stood on the site. It was restored by John, Lord Lumley, as a memorial to his family.

The cost will be £2 per head to visit Whitehall. There is no charge to visit the Lumley Chapel, but donations in the Chapel collection box will be much appreciated.

After the visits, tea and coffeee will be available at Whitehall, and they have a small shop.
