The following programme has been arranged for September and October.

Saturday 24th September

This will be the last of the Summer fixtures and arrangements have been made to visit SUTTON PLACE near Guildford. Sutton Place was built during the years 1523 to 1525 and is of outstanding historical and architectural interest. It is regarded as one of the principal examples of the Tudor period. Sutton Place has the usual Great Hall and Long Gallery (152 feet by 21 feet). It was associated with Henry VIII, Anne Boleyn and Queen Elizabeth, and contains period furniture, tapestries and some famous pictures. The charge for admission is 2/- per person.

A twenty-seater coach will pick up members at the entrance to the Leatherhead Football Ground (near the Bus garage) at 2.45 p.m. Members wishing to be picked up at the Victoria Hotel, Great Bookham, or the Effingham Cross Roads must advise the Hon. Programme Secretary when making their applications. Tea has again been arranged at the "Duke of Wellington", West Horsley. The charges are: Coach 3/-, Tea 2/-, and Sutton Place 2/-.

Members should forward with their applications for places the amount of any charges indicated above. For all applications accepted a receipt will be given which will serve to reserve tea where desired and will reserve a seat (and give the time and place for boarding) where transport is provided.
