The Village Day organizers found little comfort in the weather forecasts and to add to their anxieties, the World Cup match between England and Denmark was scheduled to be played at 12.30 pm on The Day. Would this keep most people away, and would the lunch in the Old Barn Hall, which had raised a substantial proportion of the takings in previous years, be a flop?

The situation was saved by a fine day and by J & M Radio Services who kindly lent a television, which was put in a marquee, lent by the Guides, at the bottom of the field. A neighbour kindly allowed us to run a cable from her house to supply power. Schools and Toddler Groups were informed, and we had an excellent attendance.

The procession this year was considered the best ever. Mums, (and maybe Dads), teachers, leaders and helpers had spent hours making dresses and equipment representing the Golden Jubilee for the children. The Royal Shop, (see the cartoon in the last edition of the Bulletin), must have had coronation carriages available. The very difficult task of choosing the best group fell to our President, Beryl Warne. She awarded the Peter Hancock Cup to the Dawnay Playgroup, who also won it last year. However, it was a very close thing for all the groups were outstanding and were given certificates. Congratulations on a magnificent show.

There was Line Dancing by expert adults who then guided youngsters in this art. The Dawnay School gave an exhibition of dancing and it all ended up with a Tug of War competition.

The police helped control the traffic this year. Two officers at the top of the High Street and two at the squareabout, controlled the traffic. This help was much appreciated.

## OUR ROVING REPORTER

On Village Day, Christine Leonard mingled with the crowds and asked them what they thought of Village Day and the community. Here are some of the comments:

Everyone comes together — so many children in their outfits. It's lovely to see this is still alive. I keep meeting people I know. We've only lived here a few years and where we lived before Village Day wasn't nearly as extensive and the stalls weren't as enterprising.'

Penny Clark

'I remember from 1966, when my children were tiny, in push chairs. The Days don't seem to have changed at all, everyone has a stall in same place every year. I see people here that I haven't seen all year – it's a great meeting place.' I came to Bookham under duress and wouldn't even look at houses here for six months. Now I wouldn't leave! We're so lucky. It sounds corny but Bookham has everything. OK it's grown but it's still a village. If I go to the shops on a Saturday morning I see so many people I know that I'm there for two hours!'

Gillian Povey

'We drove to Wandsworth at crack of dawn to collect the candyfloss machine—and then got stuck in traffic. Everyone was driving about before the football started, I think. People work together so well for Village Day—just look at the stalls—there's so much work that goes on before the actual Day. We haven't decorated ours because everything gets covered with candyfloss. So do we—I'll look like Miss Haversham by the end! But at least this year's parade hasn't got soaked like last year's when all the paint and make-up was running!'

### Margery Denne, Churches Together stall.

'I've been coming to Village Day for years. Last year I remember because it simply poured with rain! But it's always so colourful. People make a real effort, especially this year. I came here in a mini this morning and got some funny looks, even from a policeman, as if to say "I didn't know the Queen was coming to Bookham!" One man waved from his car.'

(Audrey from the TWG stall, was one of many splendid royal look-alikes, ranging from OAPs to tiny tots.)

'We like the new layout in the Hall – keeping lunches and teas separate works well, but we think someone from outside should judge the stalls.'

I moved here in 1996 because of the community spirit. Someone had invited me to a street party to celebrate 50 years since VE day and I thought, "I just love it here!" My only gripes are about the state of the roads and lack of recycling facilities, but I walk out of my front door and people I don't know say "Hello!" That kind of friendliness is dying out elsewhere.' Sara Sheikh on Bookham Players' raffle stall.

'You can't beat Bookham as a community, that's why I've lived here 40 years. There's concern over graffiti and new development but the shops are far better than Leatherhead's and Bookham keeps its village atmosphere with the church in the centre!' 'There's too much building of 5 bedroomed houses — it's a sign of greed and bad planning when there's nothing that young families can afford. We moan about that and the bad roads — but we wouldn't live anywhere else and we've got the Barn Hall, which is great.' 'Bookham's a lovely, friendly place to live. So much happens in the Barn Hall — you could come here every night if you wanted to!' 'The Hall is the hub of the village — provided people can get about there's no excuse for anyone in Bookham to be lonely!' 'It's such a lively community — and mixed, which is good, with so much to do you could be out all day, every day!' *Various stall-holders*.

### It's 'Time to Celebrate' Bookham success

Wasn't the jubilee great? All that was and is good about Great Britain over the years was highlighted in splendour throughout the nation. Yet, I have more reason than most of my contemporaries to cherish the celebrations following a truly memorable evening.

Having escaped the bright lights of London for a weekend, I was looking forward for the first time to spending a quiet weekend in a sleepy rural village called Bookham. Following a beautifully relaxed day, I was rather intriguingly invited to "A Time to Celebrate" – a show by the Bookham Evening Townswomen's Guild Entertainments Group, which promised an evening of pure entertainment. How could I refuse?

When I arrived at the Old Barn Hall, I was struck by the cross section of people, from young children, teenagers, to couples and grandparents. I opened my wine, the overture hushed the audience and the show began.

The curtains opened to a wash of colour and a strong choral explosion where superb harmonious singing kick-started the evening. The theme of the evening was easy to follow and took the audience

through a journey throughout the nation representing the Queen's jubilee tour. From Land's End to John

The refreshments provided at interval were a nice touch and I found myself eagerly referring to my programme to see what was coming next as I couldn't wait!

Act II was incredible. Stylish black and white costumes were so eye-catching and equally matched the brilliant rendition of the Ascot Gavotte from My Fair Lady. This was followed by a number of comedy sketches including an hilarious Morecombe and

Wise sketch – it was uncanny that they actually did look like the original duo! The rest of the evening took us through a number of musical favourites, including a number from Cats, which, if you closed your eyes, the soloist's voice sent shivers down your spine - she sang like an angel.

The show rounded off with a full chorus extravaganza where it looked like the cast had enjoyed themselves as much as 'the audience. The Barn was buzzing with positive energy and it was a pity the evening had to end at all. Whilst I can choose from all the major productions at the West End, there is something special about the application and drive which I experienced from the cast members of the Evening Townswomen's Guild Entertainment Group. It is a reminder of the value of communities and the spirit of the English village and it is incredible to discover real talent and theatrical professionalism exists within. There is not doubt I will be visiting Bookham again when it is time for the next show.

### HARRY CUDDEFORD

Many will know Harry, who died at the age of 92, as the long term resident of Great Bookham who shared what he called 52 years of "glorious togetherness" with his wife Dulcie. Some will know that when he met Dulcie, he was a sailor. He had left home before he was 16 to go to sea with the Merchant Navy. In 1926 he joined the Royal Marines and transferred to the Royal Navy in 1928. He served in the RN until 1949, leaving with the rank of Chief Engineer (CPO).

During WWII, he served in convoys and was torpedoed, which he described as a bit of a nuisance (in slightly more colourful language!). His many medals were awarded for active service all over the world.

At the end of the war he served on the flagship of the China station carrying out mopping-up operations after the fall of Japan. He visited Nagasaki which was devastated by an atomic bomb.

When he left the Navy he worked

at Ronson in Leatherhead as an engineer until his retirement in 1972. During this time Dulcie and Harry were deeply involved in many local activities. Harry helped to prepare the amphitheatre, orchestra pit and stage for the open-air theatre at Polesden Lacey. Both served there as Volunteer Stewards for many years.

In the early days of the BCA taking over the Old Barn Hall, a great deal of maintenance was required. There was no money available, so a team of volunteers toiled away every Saturday morning and, of course, this included Harry. It is largely due to their efforts that we now have a building which we are proud of and is the centre of Village activities.

Both were keen dancers, especially Old Time Dancing. They organised the New Year's Eve dance at the Old Barn Hall for over 20 years. Harry used to enter at the stroke of midnight dressed in a white sheet and carrying a scythe as Old Father Time, while a small child ran in dressed as the infant New Year. This raised funds for the BCA and this was a valuable contribution to the money required for maintenance and improvements.

They were also great workers for the annual Village Day, and Harry supported Dulcie at the weekly W.I. Friday market at which she was a leading light.

Although they did not have any children of their own, they greatly enjoyed the company of family and friends' children - Harry had the ability to entertain them with stories, and even wrote some of the stories down. He was very popular with the children.

Harry had long periods of loneliness after Dulcie died. But he kept as active as he could and kept his independence. An example of this was "Nimrod" his electric buggy on which he hurtled round the village with either his shopping or his cats in the basket.

Bookham is certainly poorer for his passing, but it may well be a little safer. Eventually, ill health forced him into hospital. After over 4 months in Leatherhead hospital he was given a place at the Royal Alfred Home for Seafarers in Banstead. He had several happy weeks here during which he enjoyed a few drinks and yarns with other "old matelots", as he put it.

Right up until his final decline, he was always a pleasure to visit and even when he felt down, he was still pleased to see friends and family and keen to have a chat. His warm personality and lively sense of humour will be an abiding memory.

I am indebted to Harry's niece, Mrs Philomena White, for providing me with the photograph and much of the information given above. Also to many of his friends and neighbours who were very fond of Harry.





## POLICE AND COMMUNITY

You will see elsewhere in the "What's Happening" part of the Bulletin mention of a Public Meeting which is being held in The Old Barn Hall on the evening of Monday 30th September.

This Meeting has been arranged by the Leatherhead Area Police and Community Partnership Group (P.C.P.G.) with the support of the Bookhams Residents' Association.

The Leatherhead Area P.C.P.G. is one of a number in Surrey. They work under the aegis of the Police Authority. Their function is to provide liaison between the Police and the local community and to develop initiatives which are aimed at improving personal and neighbourhood safety. The local Group covers Bookham, Fetcham, Leatherhead and Ashtead.

The Meeting is planned to give the people of Bookham an opportunity to meet with, and to talk to, representatives of various organisations who have a responsibility for dealing with matters of individual or general concern.

Amongst those who are likely to be present, as well as the local and Traffic Police, will be representatives from the District Council, Surrey Highways, the Youth Service, the Mediation Service and the Citizens Advice Bureau.

### Gardening for Non Gardeners

At the time of writing Summer appears to have finally arrived and members of the Garden Society will be preparing for their summer show. If you managed to get down to the Old Barn Hall you will hopefully have observed that anyone who enjoys their garden can participate even in a small way.

Autumn is approaching now, however, and following on from the tips in the last Bulletin there are few things that even the most reluctant might wish to consider.

Autumn is the time to plant bulbs such as daffodils and tulips for a colourful display in Spring. This can be a relatively simple task if you use a bulb planter - this is an inexpensive device that removes a plug of soil, which can then just be dropped back in the hole over the bulbs. For a natural effect just throw a handful of bulbs on the ground and plant them where they fall.

An easy way to clear up leaves from the lawn, if you have a rotary mower with a grass box, is to pick a dry day and use the mower with the blades set as high possible. As well as collecting the leaves this also chops them up a bit so that they rot down more quickly – so if you can find suitable a corner of the garden you could make a pile and start making you own leaf mould.

If you have unruly, overgrown shrubs that need tidying up a good rule of thumb is that flowering shrubs should be pruned just after they have finished flowering — whenever that is. Plants set seed after flowering, which is the beginning of their annual growing cycle and this gives them the longest period to recover from pruning. A note of caution, however, is that some shrubs respond to being cut right back almost to the ground whilst this will kill others. So if you are tempted to be brutal you need to check what category the particular shrub falls into.

One way of getting more information would be to join the Bookham, Fetcham & District Garden Society which for the princely sum of £1.50 gives you, amongst other things, access to an extensive library of reference books. You can find out more by calling Derek Bean on 458711 or even better by visiting our Autumn Show in the Old Barn Hall on Sunday 15 September.


Last year we introduced a wine appreciation course, which continues, and this year we are offering a new course on 'First Aid in the Home'.

### THOMAS AND WILLIAM MOORE OF POLESDEN:


Where were they buried and who sculpted William's memorial?

In the north aisle of St Nicolas Church, two memorials stand against the wall almost hidden behind the organ case. They commemorate two former owners of the Carolean house at Polesden which was built in 1631 and demolished around 1818. Thomas Moore, who commanded



The memorial to Colonel Thomas Moore is known to be the work of Thomas Carter the Elder: but who sculpted the medal and two cherubs on the adjacent memorial to William Moore and where were Thomas and William buried in the church?. New evidence has been found at the Bodleian Library, Oxford and at the University of Keele, which helps to clarify the existence of a vault in the chancel and the construction of the two memorials.

Two letters written by Zebbedee Lovemore, William's servant, provide evidence for a vault. On the day after William's funeral in 1746, he wrote to Lord North, William's executor - 'I went down in the vault myself and saw him laid close to Col Moore': later, in 1757, he wrote to Lord North to confirm details for the memorial inscriptions - 'Both (viz Thomas and William) buried in a vault in Bookham Church built by the latter for the interment of his uncle'.



Both memorials stood originally in the chancel until they were moved to the north aisle in the late 19th century, and William's inscription states that his remains lie near this place (viz. his memorial in the chancel); so the probable site of the vault is under the chancel.

Colonel Moore died on 16 March 1735; however workmen's bills suggest that his memorial was not erected until the late summer of 1758 (viz after Carter's death in 1757). The account submitted by the executors of Thomas Carter to the executors of William Moore on the 24 August 1758 gave the total cost of the memorial as £228.11.11. The executor's accounts show that payment was made in two instalments £120 on 26 Feb 1759 and £108.11. 6 on 14 April 1760.

William Moore died on 21 Oct 1746; Lord North (by now the 1st Earl of Guilford), as William's executor, was unable to provide for William's memorial until 1759. He made an agreement with Thomas Carter the Younger to provide a memorial for £145, for which he made an up-front payment of £80 on 22 Dec 1760. The account submitted by Benjamin & Thomas Carter on the 12 Nov 1761 gave the total cost of the memorial as £174. 7. 0. The executor's accounts show that a final payment was made on 22 April 1762.

The detailed evidence for a vault under the chancel and the two Carter memorials in St Nicolas Church has been published in the Leatherhead & District Local History Society Proceedings Vol 6 No 5 pp108-12 (2001).
