Bookham Community Association

The Charity Commissioners have made an order dated 10th June 1949 vesting the trusteeship of the Old Barn Hall in the Executive Committee for the time being of the Bookham Community Association.

The management of the Hall since 1933 had been undertaken in good faith by the Leatherhead U.D.C. and owing to the small number of lettings and the cost of maintenance expenditure had been incurred which had been met out of the rate fund when strictly speaking it should not have been. Further, in 1948-9 the deficit was £404 and a further sum of £60 has been expended in the current financial year to 10th June.

The executive committee of the Bookham Community Association are not unaware of the large task facing them in making the hall pay its way. It is such an asset to the Association to have such an admirable headquarters that every effort will be made to turn what has hitherto been such a "white elephant" to a living centre of social and cultural activity for Bookham.

The executive is at present busily engaged first on the terms of an agreement with the Surrey County Council for its tenancy of part of the hall for school meals, and secondly on its winter programme. Details have yet to be completed but a National Savings

event has been fixed for Friday, October 28th and an Old Tyme Dance on Saturday, Oct. 22nd in the Church House. The Halton Players who gave such an admirable performance of "Merrie England" at Polesden Lacey. have promised to visit us again in November or December to give a concert of choral and operatic items, so look out for further announcements. It is proposed to hold a series of mid-week whist drives in the evening during the winter. Further details will also be announced.

Bookham Residents' Association

The half-yearly meeting of the Residents' Association will be held at the Old Barn Hall on Friday, 30th September, at 8 p.m. All residents of Great and Little Bookham are welcome. The Hon. Treasurer will be there and outstanding subscriptions can be given to him or any other member of the Executive Committee.

Bookham Recreation Ground

At the May meeting of the Leatherhead Council it was decided that the exclusive use of one football pitch on this ground be granted to the Bookham Football Club and that the use of the second pitch be granted to the Club when not required by other organisations or clubs.

Housing Development in Leatherhead

The Oakenwood Estate is now almost complete, a further section of Barnet Wood Farm Estate has reached the Ministry of Health approval stage and let out to contractors, plans for Pound Farm Estate, Fetcham have been approved and submitted to the Ministry so that next on the list will be Bookham Grove!

At the July meeting of the Leatherhead Council it was reported that since the end of the war the Council had built 428 houses and private enterprise had built 403; war destroyed dwellings rebuilt were 46 and 41 conversions had been made.

On the Barnet Wood Farm Estate the first 20 houses are nearing completion and a further 66 houses and 24 old people's bungalows are to be built by 16 different builders. The total cost of the 90 houses will be £91,809, varying from the bungalow costing £718 10s. to the 3-bedroom C type house at £1209.

The plans submitted to the Ministry for Pound Farm Estate provide for 106 houses, some of which will be bungalows.

The number of licences issued under Defence Regulation 56a is 673, the number cancelled or revoked is 110, and 490 have been completed since August 1945, so that 73 houses remain to be started or completed.

The Selection of Council Tenants

At their July meeting the Leatherhead U. D. Council made several changes in the system of allocation of council houses, as a result of the receipt of the third report of the Housing Management sub-committee of the Central Housing Advisory Committee of the Ministry of Health.

As from the 1st August, 1949, applications for housing accommodation will be accepted from persons who were at any time prior to application resided in the district for a minimum period of three years or have been employed in the district for a minimum period of six years. The reduction of this period to one year in accordance with the recommendation of the above report will be agreed to on receipt of an assurance from the Ministry of Health that such a reduction is being universally adopted by housing authorities.

The new points system provides for two stages. Accommodation should be allocated on the basis of housing need and where this appears to be similar as measured in basic points, balancing points may be added to assist in the final selection. Basic points are awarded as follows:—

1 Overcrowding

points

(a) Bedroom deficiency, each bedrm 10(b) Statutory overcrowding of whole house, for each half unit above

the permitted number ... 2

2 Lack of separate home

(a) for sharing or lacking a kitchen (b) a living room 5 (c) a W.C. 2

3 Unsuitable accommodation

Where the applicant's present accommodation is sub-standard, points be awarded up to a maximum of 10 (the maximum to be reserved where premises would be scheduled as unfit for human habitation).

4 Illhealth or physical disability

When this is caused or aggravated by housing conditions, points to be awarded on recommendation of Medical Officer of Health up to a maximum of 10.

5 Discretionary points

Maximum of 10 points to be awarded in exceptional circumstances not allowed for in above.

Balancing points may be awarded
(a) Where one or more members have
served or is serving in H.M. Forces or

served or is serving in H.M. Forces or the Merchant Navy during war-time and is normally living with the family, or if the husband died while serving, 10 pts.

(b) Length of residence in district for each 5 years 2 points (max. 12)

(c) Length of employment in district for each 5 years 1 point (max. 5)

(d) Date of application—for each year since date of original application 1 point (max. 5)

The balancing points are only employed to distinguish between applicants who have the highest number of basic points.

The points system has been adopted in order to secure impartiality and to ease the sifting of a large number of applications. The final selection however is a matter for the Council who may exercise its discretion to cover exceptional cases and to remove anomalies that may arise in the points system.

But it is decidedly unfair to make any allegations of unfairness or favouritism and endeavour to bring the system into disrepute. With so many more applicants than there is housing accommodation, it is inevitable that there will be disappointments

Postal Deliveries

The first delivery in the Bookham area is to be completed by 9.15 a.m. the recognised time for

urban & semi-urban areas. When in a Suffolk hamlet, on holiday, our post was delivered at 6 a.m. and a letter posted to catch the evening collection in Bookham would be delivered there at 6 a.m. the following morning: but a letter posted in Suffolk to catch the evening collection is delivered in Bookham the following afternoon. Even when posted on Saturday the letter does not reach Bookham until Monday afternoon!

One of our letters was recently delayed a post, having been sent to Epsom instead of Leatherhead. This was mis-sorted because it was addressed, Bookham, Surrey and not Bookham, Leatherhead. It is always advisable to include the post town in your address.
