Editorial

If a community wants anything badly enough and there are sufficient leaders with initiative, intelligence and industry to blaze the trail, then the community will get it. We congratulate the Leatherhead Football Club on their new dressing rooms and on their public-spirited supporters, whose energy and will-power have made it possible. It is an object lesson to any other community who are anxious to provide further amenities in their district and who are faced with such observations from their authorities as: "The time is not ripe." "There is so much else more necessary." "We have not got the money, the powers, the time," or whatever it is they think will put you off the easiest.

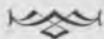

Public Relations

by *F. H. Lockett, M Inst.P.R.,

On two occasions in the past this excellent journal has recorded interesting comments on public relations; the first was in general terms and the last made specific reference to the local development of the practice. This opportunity to comment on these articles, and thereby avoid any mistaken impression of local government public relations, is therefore much appreciated. The apparent interest is most gratifying and encourages one to hope that in some future issue, an opportunity may occur to contribute some interesting details of these activities of the Council in this locally exclusive ward publication.

First, some information on the points noted in the March issue. We have never been concerned with housing, this work falling jointly within the scope of the Public Health and the Clerk's departments. The appointment was not in fact an extension of the A.R.P. Officer's duties, but a competitive interview and appropriate knowledge test happened to result in that officer being the successful candidate. No increase in staff has been necessary, the services of a typist-clerk being available and shared with another department. The mimeographed list of organisations of the whole

urban district is only one of many similar sheets we have prepared in an attempt to cover demands for information on the various amenities of the area and, like the excellent and original effort in the *Bookham Bulletin*, must depend on the co-operation of the many organisations. It will be revised, improved and re-issued at regular intervals in view of the appreciative reception of the initial effort. An underlying principal of public relations is to prevent or to penetrate any possible "smoke screen," and in cultivating good relations with the ratepayer by telling him what the Council and its staff are doing, try to bring him more into partnership with local government than heretofore.

It is apparent that the much publicised P.R.O. at government department levels often tends to be a controlled propagandist, and we P.R.O.'s of local Councils ask that our duties and policy be not confused with propagandist publicity or press officers. The local government P.R.O. must be above propaganda and free from political influence if he is to be a factor in fostering frank and happy relations between his council and the public.

To enlarge on this policy and to describe the various media for the work which includes the maintenance of cordial relations and practical co-operation with the press, local organisations, schools, and direct contact with the public through the information

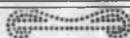

office and other means, would require the space of more than one contribution to this journal. Public Relations at local Council level may however be fairly summarised by quoting the definition framed by the local government group of the Institute of Public Relations:—

“Public Relations means the deliberate, planned and sustained effort to establish and maintain, by conveying information and by all other suitable means, mutual understanding and good relations between the local authority and the community.”

Physical Training and Health

An account of an investigation into the effects of systematic release during working hours of young industrial workers for P.T. is included in a recent report on “The Health of the School Child.”

A girl on piece work left a P.T. class after a week or two but returned a week later, reporting that her wage packet was 5% less last week.

A managing director said that while interested in the increased health and happiness of his workers, he was also interested in the 15½% increased output which was a direct result of the system.

Emptying of Cesspools

We have noticed the reply given by the Council to a request from a Leatherhead estate owner for the emptying of cesspools free of charge. The Council state that the charge of 30/- does not meet the cost.

We also note from our rate demand that nearly 11d. out of the 15/- in the £ which we pay in rates is set aside for "Sewerage & Sewerage Disposal," and which is being paid by every householder whether his house is connected to the main sewer or not.

In view of the increasing housing development of the district, this question of regular emptying of cesspools free of charge, or the

introduction of a comprehensive main-drainage scheme, should be examined fairly soon.

Bookham Grove

The majority of the flats have been completed and occupied. The rents vary from 32/8 a week to 19/8, some of them being let to council officials on service tenancies

The imposition of a speed limit on the Leatherhead Road from Beckley to Grove Side and the installation of traffic lights at the "Crown" cross roads is under active consideration by the Council.

From a recent investigation made by the Council, as a result of a dispute with the owner of Beckley Garage, it would appear that no public right of way exists along that path. However, the Council have negotiated with the owner, who has given permission

to allotment-holders to use the path by the side of his garage to gain access to the allotments in the S.E. corner.

The use of the path over the allotments is by permission of the Council, notice of which is exhibited at the entrance in Keswick Road.

The footpath from Lower Road to Church Road has been repaired for the benefit of the school children going to lunch at the Barn Hall. Railway passengers, however, face another winter with the Station footpath deteriorating more rapidly

Bus Route 418 Terminus

Some twelve months ago this journal suggested the transfer of the terminus of the bus route 418 from Preston Cross to Bookham Station. The reasons advanced were sufficiently satisfactory for the Leatherhead U.D.C. to adopt the idea, which they submitted to the London Transport Executive. The Executive agreed to the suggestion, but it was turned down by the Licensing Authority on the grounds of the danger of allowing buses to stand in Station Road and Church Road. It appears that the use of the Station Yard is not possible because of the high maintenance costs! The L.U.D.C. at their July meeting agreed to take it up again with the Minister of Transport.

Anyway it is nice to have some new buses on the route and we hope they keep better time this winter.
