Capt. Lowther has asked that the following explanation of the Colophon at the back of the new issue of the Proceedings (Vol. 3 No. 1) should be noted here.

'This flagon was almost certainly made at the potteries at Fulham (still existing) or Lambeth, both of which turned out Bellarmine flagons made of stoneware of buff colour flecked with brown and glazed and usually ornamented with a grotesque mask.'

Historical Notes

The following extracts from the Leatherhead Parish Magazine may be of interest to members.

January 1886.

'Our review of the year (1885) has no special outbreak of sickness to record, and the condition of the Parish has been fairly healthy. The number of Marriages in Church has been 23; of Baptisms 100; and of Burials 59.

The chief events in connexion with the Church has been the erection of a Lich Gate, which has added greatly to the appearance of the Church-yard, and the enlargement of the Organ, which is now a truly grand instrument - and was heard to advantage at the Re-opening Recital given by Mr. Hoyte, on 17th December.'

Later in the Magazine the Re-opening of the Organ is described. 'This Organ was originally built by Sneltzler, about the year 1750. It was repaired and enlarged to meet the needs of the Church when removed in 1873 from the West Gallery to its present position. The funds then available were not sufficient, however, to carry out thoroughly the repairs that were needed, and the instrument has since fallen into dilapidation. The Organ has now been rebuilt, completely modernized, and enlarged at considerable expense, the work being done, as in 1873, by Messrs. J.W. Walker and Sons, of London. ----- The keyboard of the original organ, which was played upon by Handel, is now exhibited as an interesting relic in the Church.'

February 1886.

'During the recent severe weather a Soup Kitchen has been opened on Tuesdays and Fridays from 12 to 1 p.m., behind Mr. Tribe's shop. About 75 gallons per week has been distributed. The kitchen will be kept open as long as it appears to be really required.'

'A Free Registry will be opened during the present month at the Registrar's Office, Mr. F. Hailstone's, Church Street, Letherhead, for the parishes of Ashtead, Fetcham and Letherhead.

Working Men, Artisans, Labourers and Mechanics of respectable character, who have been residents not less than six months within the district formed by the three parishes, may enter their names at the Registry, free of charge when in want of employment. The Registrar will be in constant communication with employers of labour in the neighbourhood. The plan has been tried with great success at Egham, and it is hoped that it may be found useful to the respectable resident working men in our parish and the neighbouring parishes of Ashtead and Fetcham.'
