

#### VILLAGE DAY

Village Day on June 26th promises to live up to its reputation of something interesting for everyone. The Exhibition in the Barn Hall "Opportunity-Bookham" will include two stands of models and interesting equipment provided by Vickers, of Weybridge. Other local firms and enterprises have promised displays, and there will be working exhibits by the students of the Epsom School of Art and Ewell Technical College.

A programme of outdoor entertainment has also been arranged. Bookham and Eastwick School are combining for folk dancing on a naval theme. A gymnastic display is being organised by that most energetic of leaders. Ken Vincent. A musical group from the Howard of Effingham School will give an open-air performance.

Special provision is being made for the children this year, which will incorporate a model railway. a children's corner and a children's market. There will, of course, be the usual sideshows and stalls, but we hope that they will be on a bigger scale this time.

Finally, as part of its activities for Village Day, the Bookham Boys' Club hopes to set up an unassailable record for mileage around the Bookhams; the target is 800 miles. This will be achieved by teams of about four boys running in relays around Great and Little Bookham, and

the boy-miles will be announced from time to time on Village Day as they are clocked up. This is something quite new for the district, and the teams of lads steadily circling the village will be a spectacle bound to create a lot of interest. Training for this event has been in progress for some time under the capable direction of the Instructor, John Boxall.

#### VILLAGE ACTIVITIES

The Cross Daggers Cricket Club has affiliated to the Community Association on taking up residence in Bookham on the Lower Road Recreation Ground. It has always had quite a number of Bookhamites among its active players, and, as its secretary, Mr. Roger Lovegrove, says, wants to feel really part of the village. We know that it will be an acquisition to the neighbourhood because it has quite a tradition of comradeship. It grew out of the war-time Civil Defence, as its name indicates, Cross Daggers being the initials of Civil Defence.

B.C.A. Over Sixties Committee. The Over Sixties Club flourishes with a membership of over 85, and is always ready to welcome new members. Evening trips round the coutryside have been

much enjoyed, and the Club is looking forward to its annual outing to Eastbourne in June. There is a chiropody service once a month on club afternoons, and also a bi-monthly service at the Day Centre which meets at the Barn Hall on Wednesdays. Information can be obtained from Mrs. T. Weston (Bookham 2706).

Visiting of the elderly remains a problem. Although the Churches and some village organisations visit their older members there are still big gaps in the service. We are concerned by this and would like to expand our own scheme in co-operation with the Old People's Welfare Committee. We need volunteers who would make regular visits to lonely old people; others who would be willing to go on a list of sick visitors. Drivers, too, are

still required to transport old people, some partially disabled, to the club on Tuesday afternoon and the day centre on Wednesday morning and back home in the afternoon. The Old People's Welfare Committee minibus is available for this purpose, but has to be collected from Ashstead. Private cars are also utilised.

The Chairman of the B.C.A. Over Sixties Committee is Mrs. Thelma Weston, who would welcome offers from all those who can give regular service. Her address — 50, Keswick Road, Bookham 2706.

The Flower Arrangement Group has a rapidly expanding membership. The creche which was started in the adjoining Waterfield Room so that mothers with young children could join the club is proving popular. Meetings are in the Barn Hall at 2.30 p.m. on the first Monday in the month. The programme ahead is "Summer Profusion", by Mrs. E. Marsh, N.A.F.A., in July. In August there will be a Garden Meeting at Preston Farm House, by kind permission of Mrs. K. Savage, and in September, Mrs. G. A. Strachan will demonstrate "Flowers, Foliage and Fruit". worthy, because it gives scope to all the members to participate in dramatic work. It is not surprising that its membership is steadily growing.

The Afternoon W.I. had 24 entries in the County W.I. Handicraft Exhibition at the Dorking Halls and gained 20 stars.

Their Drama Group carried off the Cup for Drama at the Dorking and Horley Festival of Variety with a one-act play, "The Lullaby", by Michael Dines (it was in this same play that Mary Daniels gained the award for the best individual performance at the Betchworth Festival). producer, Edith White, reports that there will be a repeat performance of "The Lullaby" at Church House on June 3rd, when the Afternoon W.I. Drama Group will put on an evening of entertainment in aid of the building fund of the Guides and Scouts. In view of these various activities the Group has decided to postpone their presentation of their annual three-act play till later in the year, probably October.

The Evening W.I. has also scored highly in the County Handicrafts Exhibition—they put in 20 entries and gained 13 stars, one of

them a gold.

Like their sister Institute they are keen on drama and they plan to put on, after the summer holidays, a sketch, "Beetlemania", sent to them by their Link Institute in New Zealand, one of whose members wrote and produced it.

There are quite a number of young members of the Evening Institute which makes the tennis section popular. It meets at the Dorking Recreation Ground for two hours on Wednesday mornings.

The total membership of the Institute is 120, and still going up. A larger meeting hall has become a necessity. Consequently, on the first Wednesday in June, it will transfer to the Barn Hall, and will continue to meet there on Wednesdays in July, August and September. After this the first Tuesday in the month will become the official date.

The Girls' Life Brigade Junior Section came top in the Team Games Divisional Trials, and then went on to London to the second round when eight teams competed. Here it achieved a place and so qualified for the Albert Hall Rally on May 15th. Well done!

British Red Cross. It is not widely known that a Bookham Cadet Unit meets at the Congregational Hall on Wednesdays at 7.15 p.m. It caters for girls and boys over the age of 10½, and gives instruction in Nursing, First Aid, Mothercraft, Health and Hygiene and encourages its members to give service to others.

The Link, for the under-tens, also puts emphasis on service and gives simple training in elementary First Aid and Health and Hygiene. It meets at 6 p.m. at the Bookham Primary School.

It is hoped that the Juniors

will progress in due course to the Senior Detachment which takes them after the age of  $15\frac{1}{2}$ . Although only a small group, this latter body does good work in the village and deserves support. The Divisional Director, Miss Doris Rush, of 94, Overdale, Ashstead, will welcome inquiries.

#### BARN HALL GROUNDS

Progress towards a more fitting setting for our much-admired Barn Hall is being made, and it is hoped that by Village Day the grounds will be more convenient than they have been in the last few years. We have been able to returf the lawn by the car park and also those parts of the open area fronting Braithwaites, which had been rather devastated during building operations: it was fortunate for us that "Sole Cote" was being demolished at the time, for we were spared the expense of turf. and, by kind permission of the owner (Mr. Crampton, of Wheate Cottage in Church Road), lifted all that we needed, although it was a race to keep ahead of the bulldozers

The north border is now 90 ft. long and there is plenty of room for extension: it is a sunny open situation, and our flowering shrubs should do well there. On the south side we have the ambition to clear the entire fence, but whether any progress has been made on this task by the time this issue of the Bulletin reaches readers depends on the
