Editorial

Some little while ago a man was caught red-handed by Hampshire Food Enforcement Officers leaving a butcher's shop with a leg of lamb under his arm for which he had not surrendered the appropriate coupons. The butcher had recently discharged his errand boy who, in spite, had given him away to the local food office.

A barrister friend of ours was briefed to defend the carnivorous customer and he persuaded him to plead guilty, although the accused was anxious to offer petty excuses to justify his greed. As was only right, the accused was fined £25 and 10 guineas costs which upset him considerably and he was extremely ill-tempered as he drove our barrister friend back to London in his high-powered car. His brooding ceased suddenly as he realised how he could recover the cost of the fines. "I'll charge it to the firm and get the money back from income tax," he told the barrister. "If that's your moral outlook," our friend said, "I wish to have no more to do with you. Stop the car and I'll continue by train." Our friend caught the next train from Alton.

Now the "black market" has varying degrees of darkness from "off-white" to "pitch black." The above case is pretty black, but if we remember that the British system of rationing is the fairest in the world and endeavours to ensure a fair share of all essentials to everybody, we should exercise our will-power in the same logical manner as our barrister friend. We should learn to say "no" to any temptation to deal in the "black market," no matter how nearly-white it is, for two very good reasons. First, it developes the wrong attitude to the State and its authority. Secondly, it developes greediness and selfishness in those who often only buy things they really don't want in order to boast about what they have managed to obtain more than their neighbour.

There would be no sellers in the "black market" if there were no buyers!

Waste Paper

Waste Paper is a most valuable and essential raw material especially in connection with the export trade of the country. The more goods we sell abroad the more waste paper and cardboard we must collect to make the board essential for packing. Waste paper also replaces imported woodpulp for making board. Not only does waste paper salvage save imports, but it also helps to sell exports.

The rates in the district are also assisted by sales of waste paper to the Paper & Board Mills. Since April last year over £1,100 has been received from such sales. The Government also pay a bonus to the Council on the amounts collected.

To the average person a wasted bus ticket, paper bag or cigarette carton counts for nothing. The importance lies in the fact that 50,000,000 average persons are involved in this matter.

If in every home in Great Britain a successful effort were made to save an ounce of waste paper or cardboard per week, it would mean an addition to salvage of 16,000 tons in the course of a year. In terms of imported wood-pulp it would represent a saving to the country of over £300,000.

The Paper and Board Mills, which can absorb more than 800,000 tons annually, are receiving only 600,000 tons. A quarter

of the plant is idle, including the largest paper-board machine in the world.

The Leatherhead Council realise their responsibility in making frequent collections and everything is being done, under present-day labour difficulties, to improve collections. A special collection will be made if the Engineer and Surveyor is notified.

The rate of interest of advances under the Small Dwellings Acquisition Act were increased from $2\frac{3}{4}\%$ to $3\frac{1}{4}\%$ in respect of all advances, the terms of which are settled on or after the 3rd February, 1948.

Houses for Bookham

Fifty council houses are to be erected shortly on the Oakenwood Estate, permission having been recently given to the Leatherhead U.D. Council by the Ministry of Health.

The houses will be of the "Orlit" type, pre-cast in concrete blocks which are fitted to a steel framework. They are attractively designed with coloured external facing and tiled roofs, and are stated to be in every way comparable to houses built with traditional materials.

The approximate cost of each "Orlit" house is £1,250. Building starts next month, the first one

being ready in six months, the remainder following at the rate of one a month—nearly five years to build 50 houses!

Leatherhead U.D.C. closed its waiting list for houses last December when it had exceeded 1000 and there was no prospect of building restrictions being lifted.

Consideration is being given by the Leatherhead U.D. Council to the question of parking of vehicles in Bookham High Street and it has been suggested that it be confined to one side, the north-east side, adjoining the majority of the shops.

Public Relations and Leatherhead

Some 12 months ago Leatherhead U.D. Council appointed a Special Duties Officer in the Clerks Department who would be responsible for various duties in connection with housing and public relations, etc., which could not conveniently be dealt with by other officials. It was an extension of the duties of the A.R.P. Officer, the same man with different duties and a different title.

With the closing of the Citizens' Advice Bureau in Leatherhead. the numerous enquiries made by the public had to be dealt with by the Council itself and as a result the public relations aspect has developed considerably. So much so that the Council at their Ianuary meeting decided that the Special Duties Officer should be independent of the Clerks Department and report direct to the Civil Defence & Public Relations Committee. This post was regraded and the salary increased. addition, the services of a typist and other establishment charges increase the cost of answering the questions of an increasingly inquisitive public.

One of the first things the district has seen from the P.R.O. is a mimeographed list giving particulars of all the organisations in the four wards of Leatherhead; doing for the other wards at the public expense what the Bookham

Bulletin, under voluntary auspices, has done for many years for Bookham. We aim to keep our directory up-to-date and the spelling accurate, given the support of the various Secretaries.

We hope that the appointment of an official P.R.O. by the Leatherhead Council does not mean the erection of a smoke screen behind which the Council will forget its duty to the rate-payers to provide efficient and courteous service with a readiness to give all the information to which a citizen is entitled.

In a recent report by the Education Development Sub-Committee of the Surrey Education Committee plans for primary schools throughout the County were submitted. Reference was made to Great Bookham primary school, adaptions of which are estimated to cost £43,800, to provide accommodation for a nursery class of 30 and junior mixed and infants of 320 in number, the work being carried out in the years 1957-62.

The increased rates of interest for loans advanced from the Local Loans Fund as from 3rd January, 1948, will mean a consequential increase in the rental of some or all council houses.
