

importance, because upon their judgment rests the fate of the Journal itself, there are the readers to be considered.

I am often told that in the present order of things there is no place for voluntary service such as was given 20 years ago for the unemployed of this country, and which through the intervening years has been provided for all in need, week in and week out, by the devoted workers of the Bookhams Social Service Bureau. Never was there a greater travesty of the truth! True, the State has taken over many of the duties formerly discharged by the voluntary societies. But the State is of necessity impersonal and in the nature of things must confine itself to satisfying material needs.

At the present time spiritual needs are paramount. Friendship, the sense of personal caring, are the things we need to-day perhaps more desperately than ever before. These things the Community Association has set itself to foster among the residents of the Bookhams, and there is good hope that through its help they may in time learn the difficult but satisfying art of living successfully together.

The "high spot" of the year, however, was a Village Day with displays of their work by many Bookham voluntary organisations. Those who attended will long remember that very popular event in the Old Barn Hall and the field adjoining, and especially the glorious weather with which it was favoured.

Later, a drama class and a music class were formed, to be run in conjunction with the W.E.A. While the former was a failure owing to lack of support, the latter continues to flourish in the comfortable surroundings of "Foulis," thanks to the kindness of Dr. and Mrs. Manclark.

It was with great regret that we accepted the resignation, last December, of our Honorary Secretary, Mr. H. C. West. Happily his active support and helpful advice are still freely at our disposal.

1949 has been full of activity. Early in the year arrangements were made for another Village Day, in the form of an outdoor performance of "Merrie England" at Polesden Lacey on June 18th. The village responded magnificently to the call for support in carrying through this ambitious venture.

Two other developments must be mentioned in this necessarily brief survey, namely the transfer by the Leatherhead U.D.C. of the management of the Barn Hall to the Community Association and the acceptance of the offer, made to the Association by the Bookhams Social Service Bureau, of the management and production of the Bookhams Bulletin. Both these developments enhance the status and increase the responsibilities of our Association, while enabling it to come more closely into touch with individual members and the Village as a whole.

HAROLD BOSTOCK A Note in Appreciation

A little more than thirty years ago there came to Bookham a Civil Servant—a robust, active man in his forties. His advent was not remarkable among the steady post-war influx of city workers, but his presence was soon to be clearly felt.

For twenty years he lived the double life of his kind—in London by day and in Bookham by night.

In his spare time he grew absorbed in village affairs, to emerge eventually as a local leader, sponsor of new ventures and the conjuror who helped to produce nearly £10,000 for the benefit of the district—in short, Harold Bostock.

His interests first embraced sport—he has been President of the Cricket Club for 21 years and is a Past President of the Football Club—but he was soon to begin a long association with the Garden Society, of which he is still the active President.

In the middle 1920's Mr. Bostock's value was recognised by election to the Parochial Church Council and a year later he became a

Churchwarden, in which capacity he carried through the project for which he will be best remembered, the creation of Church House.

He needed £4,000 for the building and he raised it in a dozen different ways by sheer persistency at a time when, like to-day, the talk was all of financial depression and saving money. Church House arose and was opened by the Duchess of York, now the Queen.

Harold Bostock's work did not end there. A hundred-and-one causes needed money and there were dozens of social events to be encouraged, for Bookham was a lively place in those days. worked for nearly all these things with results which to-day seem almost fabulous. There were the three-day village fêtes which raised some £300 a day, the memorable Gift Day on which the Rector and Mr. Bostock sitting in the Church received £580; and a long list of other triumphs.

In 1939 Mr. Bostock retired from his daily pilgrimage to prove wills in the Probate Court, but only this year did he relinquish the post of Churchwarden he had occupied

for an eventful 21 years.

Now, at the age when he qualifies for extra tea and an occasional allocation of bananas, Harold Bostock still helps where he can to mould village life with his kindly experience and the inspiration of his vigorous guidance, which did so much to foster the real community spirit in Bookham between the wars

His present home in Park View,

open land over which he went beagling when he first lived at Fife Lodge, is the spot he likes best in Bookham and there he is happy tending his garden.

Only one pursuit will now take his interests away from the village and his flowers—racegoing, the hobby of a life time. There has not been a Derby run since 1906 without Harold Bostock in attendance and he hopes to see 50 of them. The pleasure of being there and the love of the sport mean more to him than the winners, though he is no novice at picking those.

Such is the story of Harold Bostock, Bookham will be fortunate to find another of the same

mettle.

Council Chamber Notes

The valuation of small dwelling houses under Parts III, and IV. of the Local Government Act. 1948, promises to be a formidable task if it is going to be completed to the satisfaction of the Ministry of Health, the Board of Inland Revenue, the local Council and last, but I hope not least, the ratepayer. Many of the rating staff of local authorities are being transferred to the Inland Revenue and in this district will work from the new offices at The Red House. Leatherhead, which should be ready early in the new year.

Under the new Act gross value for rating a dwelling house is to be ascertained in accordance with the

following provisions:

(a) Post-1918 local authority or housing association dwelling houses, including flats and maisonettes, to be 5% of the hypothetical 1938 cost of construction, plus 5% of the 1938 site cost.

(b) Small post-1918 dwelling houses not being local authority or housing association dwelling houses, excluding flats or maisonettes and dwelling houses to which Section 72 of the Local Government Act, 1929 (Agricultural Dwelling Houses) applies, will be assessed for rating purposes at 5% of the hypothetical 1938 cost of construction, plus 5% of the value of the site on the 1st April, 1949.

Detailed specifications with the

appropriate hypothetical costs have been compiled by the Ministry under 13 heads, and site specifications have to be completed by the Local Authority for submission to the Minister.

Two new points will be obvious immediately—first, that Council houses will receive the benefit of 5% of the difference between 1938 and 1949 site values; secondly, that houses built on large plots with large frontages will be rated considerably higher than hitherto.

The Station path has recently been re-surfaced, and thanks are due to the Leatherhead U.D.C. for their prompt attention.

Table Tennis

The setting-up of a Table Tennis Club in Bookham is an achievement of which the Community Association, under whose aegis regular meetings are held on Monday evenings at the Barn Hall,

may well feel proud.

In the spring of this year, a number of us were surprised to learn that the Association was to hold a Table Tennis Tournament for the residents of Bookham and neighbourhood. There was a good response and, apart from being a successful evening in itself, the Tournament showed that there was considerable local interest in the game. The result was that the Community Association agreed that facilities should be made available for local talent to get together and form a Club. So, on the 1st April, 1949, the Table Tennis Club was born.

Apart from the provision of accommodation one evening a week at the Barn Hall, the Community Association purchased a new table tennis table for the Club. Chairman, Hon. Secretary, Hon. Treasurer and Committee were elected from among those interested, and a report appeared in the local Press concerning the formation of the Club. The membership, now 10 men and 7 women, has grown to a point where a second table is essential, and we have been fortunate in securing one on loan from the Civil Defence Club (Bookham Branch).

All the members of the Table Tennis Club are members of the B.C.A., and it is insisted that they must be resident in the parishes of Great Bookham, Little Bookham, Fetcham or Effingham. Visitors are welcome on Monday evenings, whether as players or spectators. a fee of 6d. being payable by the former. Inquiries may be made at the Club on Mondays, or by post to the Hon. Secretary at 'Pen-y-bryn," Dirtham Lane, Effingham, Surrey, from whom forms of application for membership may be obtained.

The Club as a whole wishes to take this opportunity of recording its appreciation of the great assistance afforded by the Committee of the Bookham Community Association. It is hoped that, in return, the Club will put Bookham on

the Table Tennis map.


