HISTORICAL NOTES - Leatherhead 77 years ago.

Extract from "The Leatherhead Observer" dated 20th June, 1891.

"I suppose I must congratulate Mr. Leavey that his loss is no greater. A stranger came to the town wanting work as a journeyman tailor. Mr. Leavey took the stranger in. The stranger in another way did the same to Mr. Leavey. After working about a fortnight he decamped with some garments belonging to his master. The articles were not missed until two days had passed. To Sutton he was traced where it was found the goods had been pawned. Mr. Leavey recovered the goods after paying the sum advanced by the pawnbroker. Of the man no more has been heard.

The Swan Corner Man. "

(Mr. Leavey carried on the business now conducted by Mr. Turton in Bridge Street).

In the same newspaper dated 1st August 1891 is recorded "Frank Barney, whose father is cooper at the Swan Brewery fell through a trap in a loft at that brewery into the stable necessitating the attention of Dr. Potts and Dr. Hearnden to injured rib and collar bone. He now progresses fairly."

Advance notice is given on 4th July 1891 of the Foresters Fete.

"Dinner Wednesday 15th July. Court of Eleanor Rumbyn. Provided by Mr. Stone, late of the Leg of Mutton Inn, Ashtead, who will supply all kinds of refreshments, including tea in a spacious tent erected in a meadow near Thorncroft Farm, kindly lent by Mr. Loxley for the occasion.

Dinner on the table 1.30 o'clock. Price 3/- including admission to the meadow. Bro. S.T. Maybank, Chairman, supported by Rt.Hon. George Cubitt M.P. and Canon Utterton and other gentlemen. Procession will leave the Court House at 11 o'clock headed by the Royal Esher Band. Dancing enclosure, Steam Roundabouts, and a variety of other amusements by J. Manley of Battersea. No hawking or Scent fountains allowed. Regalia of all kinds will be supplied by Bro. W.E. Sherlock, Church Walk."
