The following visits have been arranged :-

Saturday. July 13th : The Fire Service College, Wotton House, by permission of the Commandant.

You are asked to assemble at Wotton House at 3.00 p.m. Those using public transport may travel by 470 bus from Leatherhead - the Crescent - leaving at 1.35 p.m. due Dorking North Station at 1.50 approximately. A 436 bus leaves Dorking North Station forecourt at 2.10 p.m. Alight at Wotton Hatch Hotel and take the path by the side of the hotel and fifteen minutes' walk will bring you to the house.

Those arriving by car should also take the road next to the Hotel and they will find a car park at the college.

Wotton House was the residence of the famous John Evelyn and the earliest parts of the building date from the sixteenth century. Since then many alterations were undertaken and the east wing was entirely rebuilt in 1864. The gardens were also set out by John Evelyn and many interesting trees remain.

Saturday, July 20th : Fetcham Church and Badingham College (by permission of the Rev. Alan Wilkie).

Please arrive at Fetcham Church (just off 418 bus route) at 2.45 p.m. where a short talk will be given and a few exhibits shown, including the Registers (1559) and plate of 1636 onwards. A Guide Booklet is available at the Church 1/-. We are expected at Badingham College at 3.30 p.m. You are referred to an article by Mr. F.B. Benger on Fetcham Park on page 19, Vol.2. No.1 of the Proceedings for information. Copies are available at 5/- each.
