## Editorial

The Bookhams Bulletin which has been published quarterly since October 1933, without a break, is stated to be the official organ of Bookham Social Service Bureau. The formation of this organisation was first discussed at the residence of Dr. E. Price on March 17th, 1932, when Mrs. Richardson acted as chairman. Mrs. Hooper was the first hon. sec. and Miss Huffer the first hon. treasurer. Mr. Groom has been hon. treasurer since 1933.

The aims of the Bureau were stated to be "service to the community." It was an endeavour "to introduce the voluntary social worker to the already existing work." It hoped to encourage actively any new scheme of social work which it thought desirable, with activities divided between health, recreation & information.

A considerable amount of work was undertaken, particularly in connection with child welfare and the immediate relief of poverty and distress. A milk fund for necessitous children was set up in December 1932, and a young people's club started in the previous month, and a fair amount of case work was carried out. The largest single undertaking was the appeal

for funds to find work for the unemployed which was launched in January 1933, when Mr. Leavis was chairman and Mr. C. Elton was hon. sec. Apart from acting as a local labour exchange for casual work, the bowling green and children's corner were constructed as a result of the Bureau's unemployment committee.

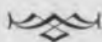
To secure greater publicity and support, the "Bookhams Bulletin" was first published in Oct. 1933 with Mr. Hanchard as hon. editor and Dr. Price business manager.

During the war, on account of difficulties of meeting and the dispersal of many of the original members of the committee, the work of the Bureau was largely left in the hands of the chairman and hon. sec. Mr. Andrews and the hon. treasurer Mr. Groom. Two meetings of the remnants of the committee have been held and it was decided that the time had come to wind-up the Bureau and reconstruct the basis of the "Bulletin."

Notice of a public meeting to deal with these matters was sent to every advertiser and to every organisation in the village. More than 100 notices were sent out and a meeting was held in the Old Barn Hall on the 5th May, when 14 people were present, the Rector Canon Hughes, was asked to take

the chair. After receiving reports from the hon. editor and hon. treasurer including a statement of accounts, considerable discussion ensued. It was proposed by Mr. Elton and seconded by Mr. Shotter "that with the issue of the September number of the Bookhams Bulletin, the Bookhams Social

Service Bureau be wound-up, and the balance of the funds transferred to the Bookham United Charities." This resolution was agreed to unanimously.

Dr. Waterfield then gave notice on behalf of the Bookham Community Association that the Bookhams Bulletin would not be allowed to cease publication, steps being taken to continue its useful work.

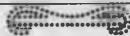

## **Bookham Recreation Ground**

The Leatherhead U.D. Council has approved the scheme for improvement to this ground submitted by their Engineer & Surveyor, Mr. J. L. Davies. The scheme provides for new and better children's play-ground equipment, two football pitches and a cricket square, together with pavilion, three tennis courts, putting green and car park. The estimated cost of the scheme is £8,000 and a similar scheme at a cost of £7,500 has been approved for Ashted Recreation Ground. Detailed specifications and bills of quantities are being prepared now, ready for invitations of tenders for the execution of the works.

The schemes will be financed, subject to Ministry of Health approval, by using a surplus of £5,238 under the Surrey Review Order, 1933, which has already been earmarked for improvement of recreation grounds generally, together with a loan repayable over a period of twenty years.

## **Table Tennis Club**

This club has been re-formed and meets every Monday at the Barn Hall from 7 to 10 p.m. The subscription is quite low.

## **Leatherhead's Housing List**

The Re-Housing Officer of the Leatherhead U.D.C. reported at the February 1949 meeting that as a result of circulating the 1064 accepted housing applicants, it appeared that 683 were still seeking accommodation in the district, 100 no longer desired to remain on the list and 281 had failed to reply. Out of the 683 live applications, 75 were "outside applications" from persons who had virtually no claim on this district.

The report also analysed the live applications according to the number of points and years residence. The number of applicants selected for accommodation during 1947 and 1948 totalled 288, of whom 199 had been living in the district for 20 years or more and only six had been in the district under five years. The number of ex-service applicants was 232, representing over 80% of the total selections.

The Council has decided that those applicants who failed to answer the questionnaire, together with the 75 outside applicants, should be struck off. New applications will be accepted from persons resident in the district at the time of applying and who have prior to application so resided for a minimum period of ten years (inclusive of war service). The position of the housing list will be reviewed again in September.

## The Rookery, Lower Rd.

Considerable concern has been occasioned by the felling of the trees at Southey Hall, opposite "The Anchor," which have been the home of rooks for many generations. Some of the trees were found to be dangerous and whilst felling these it was thought advisable to fell the whole lot. Such wholesale felling naturally gave rise to local comments, much of it adverse. No tree preservation orders have been obtained in this district yet and in spite of previous requests, The Timber Control at the Board of Trade had not advised the Council that felling was about to take place. No road widening scheme is contemplated at this site at the present time.

To the electors of Great & Little Bookham.

Mr. Robert Bishop wishes to thank the electors of the Bookham Ward of the Leatherhead Urban District for returning him as one of their members on the Leatherhead Council, and assures them that he will serve them conscientiously and to the best of his ability until it is necessary for him to seek re-election in 1952.

Although the decision of the poll was quite definite it is to be regretted that more electors did not register their votes. It is hoped that greater interest in the activities of local government will develop before local government is swallowed up by bureaucratic central government.

### National Health

The period 5th July, 1948, to 31st March, 1949, is the first milestone in the National Health Service and the opportunity to review in greater detail the financial working of the various services administered by the Executive Council for Surrey under the National Health Service Act has been taken by the financial officer.

The total payments in respect of the various services, including administration and the Councils contribution for superannuation, amounted to £2,282,439, which represents £1 14s. 3d. per head of the population of the county.
