VISIT TO SHOREHAM-BY-SEA: SATURDAY, 1 OCTOBER 1988 (Arranged by Alan Gillies)

The visit to Shoreham will be led by Dr Peter Brandon, who is a native of the town, of which he has a unique knowledge. Peter Brandon has been Head of Geography and Geology at the Polytechnic of North London, and is a former Hon Editor of Sussex Archaeological Collections. He has written widely on the historical geography of Sussex.

We shall have coffee at Lancing College, followed by a guided tour of the magnificent Chapel. There will be guided tours also of the Parish Church at New Shoreham and of the Marlipins Museum, whose collection reflects the 900 year history of the port. It is hoped to visit examples of the bungalows constructed around railway carriages, which are a feature of Shoreham beach. A guided walkabout will precede tea at Kingston Village Hall.

KELLY'S DIRECTORIES - From David Bruce

I recently had an enquiry "Were we interested in an Epsom Directory for 1938?" My immediate reaction was "Sorry, not our area", but second thoughts made me enquire "Does it cover adjacent areas, such as Leatherhead, Ashtead etc?" When the answer was "Yes, and a lot more", I gratefully accepted it for the Society.

The book, 816 pages, covers all our area, including Effingham, Mickleham and Headley, as well as Ewell, Worcester Park and Kingswood. At the beginnin of each parish is an introduction full of interesting facts and dates. For example, did you know that the Victoria Memorial Cottage Hospital in Leatherhead, erected on a site given by the first Lord Cunliffe of Headley, was opened in 1904? It was built to contain eight beds and one cot, and was enlarged in 1924 to contain 21 beds, including four private wards. Also, were you aware that the Letherhead Institute had an "annexed" tennis court?

The Ashtead section reveals that Miss F M Kitchener lived at 80 The Street. So what, you may ask. Miss Frances Madge Kitchener, a niece of Lord Kitchener, was no mean artist, and submitted a set of sketches in 1936 for the new coinage for Edward VIII, and her sketch of "Thrift" (or sea-pink) was accepted for the 12-sided 3d piece. She had to adapt her design several times, but the final version was produced by Percy Metcalfe, who also designed for the Ashtead Potters. Miss Kitchener Met a shop in Ashtead, presumably at 80 The Street. Has anyone any recollections of this shop? What did she sell - was it a picture shop - if so, has anyone any knowledge of any pictures painted by Miss Kitchener? Please let David Bruce know - Bookham 58722.

Another point of interest is the list of the names of the occupiers of Purcells Close, the neat square of 20 houses built by Lady Weaver for the workers at The Ashtead Pottery. Since the Directory was published only three years after the close of the pottery, it is most likely that most of those listed were former workers at the pottery, and they include several names well-known to the Society, such as Vincent, Over Godmon, and Robertson.

These directories are chock full of interesting details, so think twice before refusing the offer of a copy dealing with, say, Dorking or Guildford.

"EAST SURREY" - From Alan Gillies

Whilst it is correct Library practice to show the author of the above book as STREET, B in the recent Library catalogue, on this occasion it gives no indication of the subject matter of the book. "Bell Street", as given on the spine, is a pseudonym. The book is a history of the East Surrey Traction Company Limited, founded in the early years of the present century by Arthur Henry Hawkins, to provide motor bus services in the Reigate area. Throughout its history, right up to the present day as London Country (South-West), the company has been particularly associated with the Bell Street/Lesbourne Road area of the town.
