## "SURREY HISTORY"

This is the new annual magazine of the Surrey Local History Council to which your Society is affiliated. The first issue contains articles on such diverse subjects as the documents in the County Record Office, Hedgerow Dating, Firemarks in Surrey and the old houses of Shere, among others.

## The Society's Library

Over the years the Society has accumulated a large number of books, magazines and journals, either by gift or purchase, and until recently these were lodged in the main Leatherhead Library. Many of the books were of little interest from the Society's point of view, and these have been disposed of. The remainder are in the care of our Honorary Librarian (Mr. Gilbert, 34 Greenacres, Gt.Bookham, Tel. 54956) and a list of the books, which may be borrowed by members, is attached.

## Archaeology

Work is continuing at The Old Quarry, The Warren, Ashtead, although somewhat hampered by the involvement of some of the leaders in the General Election. How long the excavations will continue is not certain, and members interested in taking part, and gaining experience in readiness for the work we hope we shall he doing in connection with the M.25, should contact Mr.S.R.C. Poulter (14 Yarm Court Road, Leatherhead, Tel. 74/73) who will be able to give them up-to-date information. Hedgerow dating and documentary research linked with the M.25 is also being carried out by small groups who need additional members; if you would like to join them please phone Mr. Poulter.

#### 1974 Programme

The Honorary Programme Secretary, G. Hayward, and his assistant, E. Barnwell, have put the finishing touches to the outings, and a booking form for the coach outings is attached.

Sunday, 17th March, Brockham Railway. Meet at 2.30 p.m. in the car park of the brockham Museum - see diagram for exact location. The Brockham Museum Associa-

tion ask us to take great care when approaching the site because firstly, the lane approach is a farm track and the surface is poor although quite passible. Secondly, there is a level crossing over the Reigate-Dorking railway do <u>NOT</u> open the gates yourselves. If the gates are closed, sound your horn (or if on foot cough loudly!) and wait for the gates to be opened for you.

The Museum is in a chalk quarry and some of the kilns are still there. The Pilgrims' Way footpath passes through the museum site.

Like many societies composed of enthusiasts there is a shortage of finance and the district is is danger of losing this museum dedicated to narrow gauge railways. Admission is by temporary membership lasting two months (10p. for adults, 15p for family).

If all goes well we should be able to ride on the demonstration track. Open days are on the third Sunday of each month during the fair weather seasons - the 17th March we learn is not an official Open Day but has been laid on specially for us.

Friday 22nd March. Preparatory talks, film and slides about the outside events for 1974.

Friday 29th March. A.G.M. at the Council Chamber, 7.45 for 8.30 p.m.

<u>Tuesday 9th April</u>. Talk by Mr. W.H.E. Rivett, F.G.S., P.A.I.W.E., President of the Dorking District Naturalists' Society, on "The Weald and the Reptiles of 120 million years ago and present day studies." (Read the book called "The Weald")

Saturday 18th May. Visit by coach to Dulwich Village arranged by Mr.M.Snellgrove.

Saturday 1st June (NOTE CHANGE OF DATE) Visit by coach to walpole House, Strawberry Hill, built 1747. Sir Horace Walpole lived there.

These two trips are both afternoon excursions and due to circumstances outside our control the size of each party has to be limited to 29 persons. Ideally, therefore, enthusiasts should send in the booking forms by return of post or as quickly as possible. Cost as on booking form, no admission charge.


Sunday 16th June. Coach trip to Stonehenge, Old Sarum and Salisbury.

Saturday 13th July. Coach trip to Ely calling at (if time permits) the village of Stretham (preaching cross circa 1400, 19th c. tower windmill, engine house containing beam engine 1830) and Soham (rare weighing machine 1740, Downfield tower windmill (rebuilt 1890) and church dating back to Norman times.

Sunday 22nd September. Ironbridge, Coalbrookdale and Buildwas Abbey

See booking forms for cost of these full day trips and don't forget the meeting of the 22nd March for details. Bring substantial packed lunches for these day excursions. The times of departure from the various parishes will be shown on the tickets.



It should be understood that the cost of each outing must be paid not less than one month before the date of the event and that no refund can be made unless the person concerned can sell the ticket or the ticket can be used for someone on a reserve list. Members are also asked to make a diary note of the event and also the last date for payment as, regretfully, we will have to delete names of unpaid applicants <u>one month</u> before the event so that the size of the coach may be booked accurately.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE for the Year ending 31st December 1973

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Committee has pleasure in presenting its twenty-seventh Report.

## 1. <u>Membership</u>.

At 31st December 1973, the membership of the Society was 273, made up of 11 Honorary members, 2 Life members and 260 Ordinary members. The decrease in the overall number from over 300 last year must be attributed largely to the raising of the subscription from 75p to £1.25p. The Executive Committee elected Mesdames Lewarne and Ruby, and Messrs. Benger, Fortescue, Snellgrove, Walker and Alderman Farmer Honorary Members of the Society in recognition of their continuous membership since they were elected at the first Executive Committee meeting on 3rd December 1946. Two others with a similar membership record, Messrs. Dalton and Lewarne, were already Honorary Members.

The Officers and Committee Members retire at the Annual General Meeting, and are eligible for re-election. Nominations for the Committee should reach the Hon. Secretary not later than 27th March 1974, and should state:- (a) the name of the Nominee; (b) the Names of the Proposer and Seconder, and (c) that the Nominee has expressed his or her willingness to serve if elected. Mr. D.F.Renn (Chairman for the last five years) will not be standing for re-election, since he feels it is time for a change. Special thought will be necessary when considering the selection of a suitable candidate for this important post. The Hon. Treasurer resigned as from 31st Dec. 1973, and the Committee appointed Mr. Bull Acting Treasurer until the A.G.M. The services of Mr. Renn and Mr. Stokes will be greatly missed

## 5. Accounts.

A Statement of Income and Expenditure for 1973 is attached. The continued financial support of the Surrey C.C. and the Leatherhead U.D.C. is gratefully acknowledged by the Executive Committee. Donations were received from a number of members.

## 6. Subscriptions.

The increased subscription of £1.25 for 1973 was necessary to meet increased costs. This amount is again due as from 1st January 1974, and early payment to the Hon. Treasurer would be appreciated.

## 7. Other activities.

Apart from the very full programme of lectures and visits, other activities have taken place. Lectures on the history of the various parishes in our area have been given by two or three members to local organisations and have been greatly appreciated. In anticipation of considerable archaeological developments following the announcement of the route of the M.25 motorway, close contact has been maintained with a special Motorway Coordinating Committee held under the auspices of the Surrey Archaeological Society. With a view to publishing in due course a History of Ashtead, a group of members and others are actively processing a large amount of material assembled by our late President, Captain A.W.G. Lowther.

## 8. Local Records.

The Society continues to acquire documents and photographs pertaining to our area, and the Committee wishes to thank all those who kindly gave this material to augment our records. With the advent of the M.25 and redevelopment of the centre of Leatherhead, much that is now familiar will shortly disappear, and photographs and slides of Leatherhead as it is today are urgently required if it is not to go unrecorded.
