

As one who has been privileged for nearly eight years to seek to arouse interest in and evoke help for destitute refugees, I rejoice in the present national (and indeed international) effort to make a significant impact on the refugee problem in this World Refugee Year. The United Kingdom W.R.Y. Committee has defined its objects: to help bring the European refugees out of China (some of them "White Russians" who fled to China in 1917); close some of the Camps in Europe under the mandate of the U.N. High Commissioner for Refugees; contribute to the relief of the Arab refugees, and also help the Chinese refugees major problems.


