# FIRE-MARKS IN OUR AREA - From David Ellis

When fire insurance was introduced towards the end of the 17th century, the insurance companies produced metal plates which were affixed to the buildings insured by them. These fire-marks, as they are called, have the company's device and a number indicating the policy relating to the building. They represent some of the earliest examples of advertising, and they are of

particular interest to local historians because many of the insurance records survive, and thus it is possible to obtain information about a property at the time that the insurance was effected. Such records are held today by the large companies which eventually took over the small ones founded in the early years of fire insurance, or are held in County Record Offices. Some companies, including the Sun Alliance and the Commercial Union, have lodged their records at the Guildhall Library in London.

Some fire-marks show the company's emblem only and not the policy number: these are strictly known as "plates". Such a plate, issued by the Sun Fire Office, can be seen on the front wall of No 19 Barnett Wood Lane, Leatherhead.

The majority of the fire-marks to be seen on buildings today date from the 18th century or early 19th century. It would be of interest to compile a list of the fire-marks still to be seen on buildings in Ashtead, Bookham, Fetcham and Leatherhead. Any member who knows of any local fire-marks or plates is invited to send the details to me, and I will publish a list in a future number of the Society's Newsletter: David Ellis, 23 Kingscroft Road. # THE OUAKER TAPESTRY

Guildford Borough Council are holding a "Quaker Tapestry Exhibition" at Gallery 90, Ward Street, Guildford between 1 and 29 June 1991.

Inspiration for the Quaker Tapestry which was begun in 1981, came from the Bayeux Tapestry and like that tapestry is in three sections. Over 2000 Quakers at home and overseas have contributed to its embroidery. It tells the story of the Quakers and their many activities and professions from 1643 to 1986.
