"... the Clerk wrote to Mr. Todman at the Swan at Leatherhead to provide a Fillett of Veal Roasted and the knuckle boiled with Bacon and a Bread Pudden boiled, but no fish, against the Company there to dinner." The above extract was supplied by J.Nevinson Esq.

who comments that he assumes the fish they did not like was the water souchet (souchy) broiled perch, which was a Dorking delicacy.

Each year the Carpenter's Company - the Masters and Wardens paid an official visit to Wyatt's almshouses in Godalming. In the 17th century they usually went via Ripley, but in the 18th century the Ashtead, Dorking route was preferred.
