## Editorial

The Trades Council of a neighbouring town has expressed the opinion that a Community Association was needed in their district for the benefit of the local cultural life, and appointed a committee to convene a meeting. Later, at the same meeting, a resolution was passed addressed to the Prime Minister calling for a "real socialist programme, both at home and abroad, which would strengthen the whole of the working class."

We venture to suggest that a strong partisan organisation is the least competent to sponsor an association which aims to develop a spirit of community in the neighbourhood. The introduction of party politics into local government has been unfortunate and the increase in the number of electors polling at the recent borough elections cannot be at all reassuring to a thinking man. Must a candidate wave either a blue or red flag or have a central office label before local electors will go to the poll?

The powers of local authorities are dwindling and will continue to

dwindle because members of local authorities are increasingly becoming professional politicians regarding their election as a step towards membership of the County Council and House of Commons. Local authorities need men of integrity, above party bias, who are able to bring common sense and business acumen to bear on local problems.

The emphasis on class is also repugnant to the whole idea of community. The ideal village or town community consists of all types of people, earning their living in a variety of different ways. Then at the village church, club or pub, wherever they may meet, they will find somebody with a different point of view and nothing is better than second thoughts which listening to another opinion provokes, even though the latter opinion is not always accepted.

Finally next March, the election to fill the vacancies left by the retiring third of the Leatherhead Urban District Council will be held. Let Bookham continue to send a man or woman above party politics who is willing to do a good job of work for the community, working for the good of the greatest number, using their *own* brains common sense and judgment.

## Bookham Commons

---

These Commons Gt. Bookham Little Bookham and the Banks—of a total area of 447 acres, are controlled by a local committee on behalf of the National Trust, the present members being Capt. the Hon. D'Arcy Lambton, R.N., Sir Charles Cunningham, Dr. A. M. Easton, Messrs. H. Bostock, H. J. Burkitt, R. R. Calburn, V. Hinde, L. R. Hutchison, D. Macer-Wright (Hon. Treasurer) S. Madge, H. Teesdale, T. E. Ware (Chairman). New members must have the approval of the National Trust.

The committee meets at least once a year to receive and approve the accounts and draw up a report on their activities during the year for submission to the N.T. Other meetings are held as required.

The committee is responsible for supervision of the commons, to provide labour for maintenance, to preserve as far as possible the natural beauties, its wild life (which entails the destruction of pests such as grey squirrels, rats, stoats and weasels that prey upon the rest), to regulate the growth of underwood, to control the cutting of turf, loam and holly, and generally to carry out the practice of good forestry.

As the Commons were handed over to the N.T. "as open spaces for the benefit of the public," it is

the business of the committee to see that the public do not abuse their privileges by indiscriminate parking of vehicles, camping, lighting fires, leaving litter, the illegal taking of timber, holly, primroses, birds of all kinds, game & rabbits. Cars can not be driven over the commons except on a few rights-of-way for vehicles—drives and footpaths cannot be so used, but parking places on three sites are provided.

Though the committee is allowed a free hand in most matters, all of major importance are dealt with by the head office of the Trust, whose agent attends meetings of the committee if he so wishes.

Any member of the committee may intervene if he sees any infringement of the bye-laws.

Of the present committee Capt. Lambton and Mr. Madge were of the first elected in 1923, both having an unbroken membership. Admiral Yelverton, C.B., recently retired, was its first chairman, a position he occupied without a break for 15 years. Capt. Lambton was his successor, and when he resigned on account of indifferent health, the Admiral resumed the chairmanship together with that of treasurer. The great interest he took in the commons and the work of the committee during the 25 years of his membership (an interest he still retains) is highly appreciated by his fellow members who greatly regret his

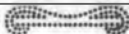

retirement. The National Trust were very conscious of his worth, personality and good humour. The inhabitants of Bookham interested in the Commons will long remember him as the Grand Old Man of the Common.

Bookham Common, 332.5 acres was acquired in 1922 by subscribers, three of whom, A. H. Graham, C. V. Gordon-Clark and H. W. Randall, referred to as donors in 1923 handed it over to the National Trust as an open space for the benefit of the public, subject to certain restrictions.

Little Bookham Common, 75

acres, was presented to the N. T. in 1924 by H. C. Willock-Pollen, of the Old Rectory, Little Bookham, also subject to reservations.

Banks Common, 33.6 acres, part of the wastes of the Manor of Effingham, was given in 1925 by R. R. Calburn, Lord of the Manor of Effingham (subject to certain rights retained).

Do you realise that, on your doorstep, there are 447 acres of Common, preserved for the enjoyment of the public? Here at any time of the year, is a quiet and pleasant place through which to walk or over which to ride.

## A Modern Luxury

Have you ever written and complained to a large public body or department and received back that "soft answer which turneth away wrath?" Have you then felt that after all there was nothing much to worry about now that it has all been explained to you by the appropriate "Public Relations Officer?"

This newer branch of the Civil Service now costs £878,468 yearly for 1,100 officers. There are also highly paid P.R.O.'s and their staff employed by the numerous Public Boards and large commercial undertakings.

The proposal now is that local government should develop this side of their administration and a report from the National Association of Local Government Officers states that a total of £1,300,000 would be sufficient to pay for all the schemes suggested. This is revealed in a Parliamentary White Paper just issued on publicity for local government.

Ratepayers generally will be relieved to read in this White Paper that it is wrong to suggest that "a local authority cannot carry out consistent and effective publicity without elaborate machinery and considerable expenditure." In fact the White Paper contains several statements which well may be taken to heart by every public body dealing directly or indirectly with the public.

It is important, the committee

responsible for the White Paper declares, that the officers entrusted with the task of interviewing the public should be of sufficient responsibility and training to inspire confidence. "The public relations spirit ought to permeate the whole organisation." This means, to quote The Times, that men and women must know their job, be courteous in their business dealings, be ready to give the information to which citizens are entitled, and not hope to be saved from these obligations by a *dens ex machina* called a P.R.O.

## Station Path

The Leatherhead U.D. Council have offered to take over the Station Path provided it is put into a proper state of repair first. The local committee of the National Trust however state they have insufficient funds to repair the path and ask the Council to take it over as it is. Meanwhile, the many users of this path will continue to be discomforted for another winter.

## Little Bookham Village Hall

This hall, which is mainly used by a Youth Club and as a polling station for local parliamentary elections, is appealing for financial help from the residents of Little Bookham. In view of the rationing of potatoes and the high prices charged for vegetables, the cultivation of an allotment is a valuable contribution to the national larder, and an allotment association will help the individual considerably.
