Fixtures

We have now been able to arrange a series of fixtures to cover the period April to September, and details are given below. In our last circular we suggested a visit to Milton Court, Dorking, in April, but we have found we cannot go into the building on a Saturday afternoon, and furthermore the interior has been altered for office accommodation.

Saturday, 18th April, 1953

Wotton House, Wotton Church and Ockley.

A motor coach will leave The New Bull, Leatherhead, at 2.30 p.m. for Wotton House where by courtesy of the National Fire Service, who now inhabit the building, we may look over it. The house lies in the Tillingbourne valley and was the home of the Evelyn family. Short notes about the place will be read to us.

After leaving Wotton House we shall move on to Wotton Church, where there is a most 'interesting' doorway said to have been fashioned during the reign of King John. The Vicar of Wotton, Rev. A.C. Nickel, has very kindly consented to meet us and tell us about his church.

Tea will be taken at The Red Lion, Ockley, and afterwards we propose (weather permitting) to view the site of the battle against the Danes in 851. Again in this case a paper will be read to us about the battle, outside if the weather is fine but inside if not.

Saturday, 16th May, 1953

Nature Study Ramble over Bookham Common

Dr. Topping will conduct this Ramble over the Common to Bookham Station. It is possible to obtain tea at Bookham at the Grange.

Saturday, 13th June, 1953

Lewes, Sussex

A member of the Sussex Archaeological Society, Mr. L.F. Salzman, has kindly agreed to take us over and talk about Lewes Castle and The Barbican House Museum. The coach will leave The New Bull, Leatherhead, at 2 p.m. and immediately on arrival at Lewes we will have tea at Holloway's Restaurant in the High Street. Mr. Salzman will give a brief description of the places during tea.

Clandon Park

Arthur Onslow was Speaker for 33 years and presided over every Parliament in the reign of George the Second. Saturday, 15th August, 1953

Thorncroft and Leatherhead Church

We are proposing another visit to Thorncroft and afterwards to Leatherhead Church. We shall meet at Thorncroft at 3 p.m., and Mr. F.B. Benger will talk to us both about the house and the church.

Tea can be obtained at The New Bull, Leatherhead, at about 2s.3d. each. I should be pleased to book teas for members if they will let me know, but payment should be made to the hotel when tea is taken.

Saturday, 19th September, 1953

Fungus Foray in Woods behind Box Hill

The party this afternoon will be conducted by Dr. Topping, and will start from Juniper Hall 2.45. There is a car park there and the No.470 bus leaves Leatherhead Institute at 2.34 for Juniper Hall.

Tea can be arranged at a cost of 1/9 each at the Hall and after tea the specimens collected will be displayed in the laboratory there.
