February Lecture

I hope you will be able to come along to The Mansion, Church Street, Leatherhead, on Wednesday 18th February, to hear Mrs. M.A. Cotton, O.B.E., F.S.A., talk about "Iron Age Hill Forts in South-East England". The lecture, which is to begin at 8 p.m., will be illustrated by lantern slides. Although we cannot lay claim to one of these fortifications in the Leatherhead area, there are several overlooking the Weald within easy reach at War Coppice, Caterham, Anstiebury Camp, Holmbury Hill and Hascombe, as well as others to the North overlooking the Thames Valley, and Mrs. Cotton's talk should do much to add interest to any future walk over one of these long abandoned sites.

Future Programme

Two further lectures are being arranged, one in March on a geological subject, and one in April, when it is hoped that Captain Lowther will talk about Roman remains in our area. This latter event will be a suitable introduction to the trial excavation which it is hoped to carry out in the summer near Headley, on a site which has shown some evidence of Roman occupation.

Your Executive Committee have also discussed plans for a summer programme of outings, and details of these and the two lectures mentioned above will be given in later circulars. The organisation of these events is in the capable hands of your newly elected Programme Secretary, Miss Elizabeth Harrison, of "Common End", Eastwick Drive, Great Bookham.
