Lectures

I am now able to give you particulars of the two remaining Lectures of this winter's series. Both will be given at the Mansion, Church Street, at 8 p.m.

On Wednesday, March 18th, Mr. W.H.E. Rivett, F.C.S., F.L.S., P.A.I.W.E., the Secretary of the Dorking and District Naturalists' Society, will talk on "Geology and Evidence of Early Reptiles in the Dorking Area". Mr. Rivett will illustrate his talk with drawings, maps and specimens, and as well as discussing the geology of the whole area, will describe finds made in brick-workings near Ockley.

On Wednesday, April 15th, your Chairman, Captain A.W.G. Lowther, F.S.A., A.R.I.B.A., will speak about "Roman Remains in the Leatherhead Area". If you are not already familiar with this subject, Captain Lowther's talk will help to give you a general picture of the district in Roman times, with special reference to the structures at Ashtead, revealed during his excavations some years ago. There will of course be slides to illustrate this Lecture.

I would like to remind you that guests are welcome at all our Lectures, but in order to help meet the ever-increasing cost of running the Society, Members are asked to contribute one shilling for each guest present.
