NEWSLETTER 3 1984: DECEMBER 1984

Dear Members,

We have the very sad task of starting this Newsletter by recording the death of two of our members.

Firstly, Mrs Cecily Barrett, who until quite recently was our Membership Secretary, a post she held for over six years. It is scarcely any time since she sold her bungalow in Bookham and went to live with her daughter in Forest Hill. Very soon after she settled there, her grandson was killed in a road accident. She then went to Canada to stay with another daughter, and there she had a heart attack and died at the end of September.

Secondly, Mr John Giuseppi, who died at his home in Warwickshire. He joined the Society in 1967 and was an active member during the time he lived in Esher, before retiring to Wellesbourne in Warwickshire. Mr Giuseppi was also a founder member of the Esher District Local History Society and an active member of their Committee. He was a Vice President of the Surrey Record Society. He made his career in the Bank of England.

To the families of both Mrs Barrett and Mr Giuseppi, we send our sympathy.

LEATHERHEAD MUSEUM - From David Bruce

The only construction work left to do is to build dwarf brick walls in the garden to maintain the level of the flower beds along the boundary walls and fences. These are necessary because the level of the paved part of the garden has been lowered some 8 - 12 inches to maintain a correct level relation to the damp-proof course of Hampton Cottage. If the whole of the garden level had been lowered, the boundary walls and fences would have been under-mined. The soil being removed has been sieved to ensure that no object of interest is being thrown away, but so far very little of note has turned up (see note on Monogrammed Button). Perhaps we shall have better luck when the well is cleaned out.

During October, an exhibition supplied by the Surrey Museums Council, entitled "Bricks and Tiles in Surrey", and produced by Guildford Museum, was on display. The well-illustrated panels depicted the use of these materials through the ages from Roman times until the 20th century, along with specimens of bricks and tiles.

Frank Rice-Oxley, the Treasurer of the "Friends of the Leatherhead Museum", has very generously given to the Museum an extensive range of modern portable display boards. This will save the Museum making a somewhat expensive purchase which it had planned to do as soon as funds permitted.

We welcome to our ranks Mrs Mary Cree, Murreys Court, Agates Lane, Ashtead, who has agreed to look after the important aspect of staging future displays in the Museum. She will "cut her teeth" by putting on a Christmasy display during December, but there may not be sufficient time for her to do the subject justice. Ideally subjects for displays should be chosen over a year ahead, and no doubt she will be looking to our members to cooperate with her on devising exhibitions on subjects of their choice. Already "Inns and Brewing in Leatherhead" and "Literary Leatherhead" have been proposed, and we are sure members can suggest many others. Offers of help, please.

The last opening of the Museum in 1984 will be on Saturday, 15 December, and it will remain closed to the public until April.

Our thanks to Peter How for answering our appeal for tobacco tins. Also to Gilbert Smith, John Wall, Mr & Mrs Goodrich and others who have helped to re-decorate parts of Hampton Cottage. This is a continuing task, and help will always be required for work of this nature.

If anyone has a spare pair of secateurs which they could give to the Museum, they would be very welcome.

MONOGRAM AT HAMPTON COTTAGE - From David Bruce

Found in the garden at Hampton Cottage were two brass buttons bearing a monogram composed of the three intertwined letters M, J and C. The usual convention with monograms is that the most important initial (ie that of a surname) is the largest, although this is not always followed if the nature of the letters, or the look of the monogram, requires them to be put in a different order of size.

In this case the C seems to be the largest, although it may be the J. The M is definitely the smallest, so the monogram could be read MJC or MCJ, although as mentioned above, it is possible they could be in any order.

It is unlikely that the buttons would have been manufactured for an individual; more likely the initials will be those of an organisation. Can anyone suggest what they stand for? Does C stand for Club or College?

The buttons were manufactured by Firmin & Sons Ltd, London, Patent 234? (the last number could be a 9, 0 or 6), who have been making military and naval buttons since the 17th century.

PARISH RECORDS - From David Bruce

Every so often, the Society is given a photograph of a street scene in our area and the question arises - "When was it taken?" Then begins a guessing game: "When did Wakefields close down?" "When was that block of flats built?" and nobody is quite sure. Would it not be a good idea if, in each Parish (Leatherhead split into two) someone recorded in a diary such events occurring in their area. Apart from changes in shop occupation, demolition and/or erection of buildings, such things as road widening, tree felling, traffic light installation - indeed anything that changes the aspects of the area - could be recorded, together with changes in local councillors, head teachers, bank managers, or the death of any local worthy. Such information may not seem to be of any great importance now, and it may be argued that this information could be obtained from back numbers of the local newspapers or a visit to the Council Offices, but to have on record brief lists of changes, year by year, would be of great value in the future. LOCAL NEWS 1906

We have recently been given a copy of The Observer and Mid-Surrey County Chronicler for 30 November 1906. It contains the following items:

"At a meeting of the Epsom Rural District Council, they were advised by the Leatherhead & District Electricity Company that the work (electric light trenches) being carried out in Barnett Wood Lane was of such a nature as to render it improbable that the lane would be open again for some years to come."

"The Council Surveyor had advised the Electricity Company that if they did not reinstate the road to his satisfaction, he proposed to do the work and charge them with the cost."

"The Council were advised that five cases of scarlet fever, three cases of diphtheria and one case of puerperal fever had occurred in the western district during the past month. Resolved that the Medical Officer be requested to issue his certificate for the closing of the schools in Great Bookham if any fresh case of disease should occur."

"The fund opened by Mr H W Eastland (station master at the LB and SCR Station) in aid of the widow and family of Porter Elliott, who was killed at the Leatherhead Station a few weeks since, had reached the splendid total of £57 3s, and that sum has now been deposited in the Capital and Counties Bank in the name of two trustees, and a weekly allowance will be made to the widow until the sum is exhausted."

#### SURREY ARCHAEOLOGICAL SOCIETY POLICY ON TREASURE HUNTING

A letter dated 18 June 1984 has been received from the Surrey Archaeological Society. We have been asked to publish the contents of it, so what better can we do than quote it in its entirety.

##### "Society Policy on Treasure Hunting

At a recent meeting of the Council of the Society, it was agreed that the policy of the Council for British Archaeology (the CBA) on treasure hunting be adopted as the formal policy of the Society. The CBA statement reads as follows:

'In the view of the CBA, treasure hunting constitutes a grave threat to the country's archaeological heritage and is thus contrary to the national interest. The concept of treasure hunting is totally at variance with the objectives and practices of archaeology in studying and safeguarding our tangible past for the public good of present and future generations. The Council recognises that many users of metal detectors are motivated by a genuine interest in the past and its remains. Such people are welcome to join the active membership of British archaeology but they must accept the methods and disciplines of archaeology.'

I would be most grateful if you could bring this aspect of the Society's policy to the attention of the members of your Society or Group. #### THE DALLAWAY LECTURE : "SURREY HILL FORTS"

The Chairman opened the proceedings of the 1984 Dallaway Lecture by explaining to the audience of about one hundred people, that the lecture is named after the Rev James Dallaway who was Vicar of Leatherhead from 1801-1837, as well as holding the Sinécure Rectory of Slinfold in Sussex, and being Prebendary of Chichester Cathedral for 15 years. He was also a Fellow of the Society of Antiquaries from 1789.

He was a man of many interests and a prolific writer on the arts and architecture, heraldry, local history and foreign travel. He had intended to write a history of Leatherhead but he did not get very far with his researches, and the Local History Society is now having to finish the job.

Following this introduction, a most interesting talk on Hill Forts in South East England was given by Mr Hugh Thompson in which he concentrated on the three in Surrey: Antbury, Holmwood and Hascombe. All three had been excavated by Mr Thompson and he showed some excellent slides of both the excavations and general views of the forts. Not a great deal had been found during the excavations and Mr Thompson put forward the theory that the forts had been built in a hurry by local inhabitants as defences against Julius Caesar's army in the 57 BC incursion, and because he did not come very near the forts were never very much used.

Our grateful thanks to the City of London Freeman's School, and Mr Kemp the headmaster in particular, for allowing us the use of their lecture hall and providing us with coffee.
