WE A COURSE - SPRING TERM 1997

Industrial Archaeology - A University of Surrey course

NEWS FROM THE LIBRARIAN (Gwen Hoad)

"The beer-house facing the (Ashtead) Common, bearing the sign of "The Woodman" was an isolated cottage until the construction of the railway was commenced in 1857-58. For the first few months that the works were in progress the large

number of navvies and other workmen employed thereon were supplied from a moveable store, similar to a gypsy's van, until the magistrates' licence was granted." Just one snippet from "Ashtead Past & Present", a series of notes contributed to the Ashtead Parish Magazine in 1902-3 by J E Smith, and collected together in one slim volume in the Society's reference library.

This brings me to five volumes of the Leatherhead Parish Magazine dating from the end of the nineteenth century which have recently been expertly and inexpensively re-bound or repaired by Mr Simon von Benckendorff of Woking. Four of these bound volumes were left at the Museum by a member of the public who was going to throw them away! They now form part of the Society's growing reference library.

"ARCHIVE PHOTOGRAPH SERIES - LEATHERHEAD"

This book of Leatherhead in old photographs will be on sale to members at our Christmas Miscellany, when Linda Heath will (if requested!) sign any copies bought that evening. The book contains over 200 photographs, mainly belonging to the Society, many of which have not been published before. They date from about 1870-1950 and form a fascinating picture of a Leatherhead now gone for ever.

Linda has spent several months selecting these photographs and writing the text for them. She has been assisted in various ways

by other members, so it is very much a Society production. We hope all members will buy a copy and encourage others to do so. It will be available at the Museum until it closes for the winter on 21 December, in local bookshops and the public library; but the Society does benefit financially if members can buy it at our meetings or at the Museum. "H M S SCOUT - TO THE PEOPLE OF LEATHERHEAD"

That is the wording on a small commemorative shield in our Museum which was sent to the people of Leatherhead by the crew of HMS Scout, a destroyer adopted by the people of the Leatherhead district during Warship Week 18 - 25 October 1941. The crews were sent letters, gifts and knitted clothing (gloves, socks, scarves, etc) by the people of the town or village who adopted their ship.

The local newspaper received a letter in 1944 from Able Seaman T W L Blunt, who had returned to England after serving aboard Scout. He said "I would like to offer you all my thanks in appreciation for what you are doing for the crew. Your gifts of books and records were very gratefully received, and at times were the only means of keeping in touch with reality."

Scout was built at John Brown's, Clydebank, Glasgow; a famous shipyard whose achievements included the ill-fated Lusitania, and later for Cunard, the Queen Mary and Queen Elizabeth. Scout was a modified Trenchant or "S" Class (1917-18 Programme) destroyer, launched on 27 April 1918.

At the outbreak of World War II, she was serving in the China Station on local defence duties between Hong Kong and Singapore. She spent most of the war in the Far East, being part of the Western Striking Force and later taking part in operations in the Indian Ocean. In February 1944 she was fitted out at Colombo as a torpedo target ship, and was finally classified as an accommodation ship. On 27 March 1945, she arrived at Trincomalee and remained there, under care and maintenance, until the end of the war. Scout was finally scrapped in 1946.

HMS Scout is commemorated in the entrance hall of Wesley House, Leatherhead, the former Local Council Offices.
